Appliances

– Non-working:

Always ask your retailer about their haul away/recycling program before you purchase a new appliance.

Check with local scrap yards or your Community for possible cleanup dates, used appliance dealers and landfills. Kimble's will accept them with service tags attached (proof of proper freon removal). Check with a local refrigeration repair service regarding certified removal.

Batteries

Dry Cell/Zink Carbon/Alkaline Batteries can be safely placed in your trash in small quantities. NOTE: It is a fire hazard to store alkaline batteries with untapped (positive and negative sides) in large quantities. Please tape the ends of them if you plan to store to recycle them. In 1996 the Mercury-Containing and Rechargeable Battery Management Act phased out mercury in AAA, AA, C, D and 9v batteries making them perfectly safe to dispose of in your garbage. **Button-cell, coin** or any battery marked lithium should not be placed in the trash. Any of these batteries are accepted at our Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection, details can be found on our website Special Collections page.

Rechargeable electronic batteries are usually accepted at stores that sell them, and at our Special Household Hazardous Waste Collections, check our “Upcoming Events” page on our website for future dates/locations.

Cell phone batteries may be acceptable at business that sell cell phone equipment or an electronics recycling business such as **Infinite Electronics, Inc.**, 110 Main Street, Lower Level, Wintersville.

For Rechargeable/power tool batteries

Cell Phones/Wireless

You can recycle your wireless device through a drop-off location, mail back programs, through an internet auction site or by donating it to a charity such as school fund raising activities, or women's shelters. Three things to remember before you recycle your wireless phone:

1. Terminate your service
- (continued)

2. Clear the phones memory of contacts and other stored information
3. Remove your phone's SIM card, if it has one. Phones that operate on GSM networks use SIM cards. If you are not sure if your phone uses a SIM card or if you need assistance removing your SIM card contact your wireless provider.

Christmas Trees

- Your artificial Christmas Trees **cannot be recycled**; it must be disposed of with your trash. If you used a live cut Christmas Tree you may have several options:
 - Ask if there is a hauling/composting option through your city or village.
 - Remember to remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights, and decorative materials including the tree stand.
 - Ask your trash hauler if they provide live tree pickup after the holiday season. (continued)
 - Ask your local Christmas tree grower if they will accept your tree for mulch or other disposal.
 - If you know someone with a chipper, they may be willing to chip your tree into mulch for your garden. Pine needles are a great mulching source to help acidify soils for potatoes and blueberries. For non acidic plants, you may need to apply garden lime on the mulch to counteract the acidity.
 - If you own a fish pond, trees make an excellent refuge and feeding area for fish. Never sink your tree into a pond without permission from the property owner.
 - A Christmas tree positioned in your garden or backyard can be used as a bird feeder and a safe shelter for birds and other wildlife. Please make sure all

decorations, hooks, garland or tinsel strands are removed so as not to injure the birds or other wildlife. Within a year the tree branches become brittle enough to break up the tree by hand for use on your property.

NEVER burn your Christmas tree in a fireplace or wood stove. Burning pine trees may contribute to creosote buildup and could cause a chimney fire.

Fluorescent Lamp, Compact Fluorescent & Ballast Light Bulbs UNBROKEN

You may save them for our next Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection. Information is posted on our website under the News & Events tab on the Upcoming Events page once announced, or just like us on Facebook.

Place broken CFL's in a garbage bag, (NEVER use a vacuum to collect – it will disburse the mercury into the air) seal the CFL in two plastic bags and put it into the outside trash as recommended by the Ohio EPA. CFLs should not be disposed of in an incinerator.

Gasoline cans

– Dispose **Empty**, clean cans with cap removed in regular trash.

Gasoline (water mixed/unusable)

– Safely store until Solid Waste Authority holds its next Household Hazardous Waste Collection. **Clearly mark all items** you bring to this event.

Glass/ Windows, large Mirrors

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You might also consider placing a notice on free trading websites such as www.freecycle.com or “freecycle” on facebook. Where old windows, etc are frequently sought by architects, salvagers, artists, crafters and gardeners.

Glass windows & mirrors can be disposed of in landfills.
Because window glass has different additives and melting temps, it CANNOT be collected with the glass jars and bottles for recycling.

Helium Tanks

Balloon Helium Tanks are designed to be disposable, although some stores may accept them for recycling. Scrap dealers usually do not accept them due to serious safety issues from unused helium. Please always follow the safety instructions/directions on the tanks as they can be an explosive hazard if any helium remains in the tank when compacted in a trash truck or cut for recycling.

Ink/Toner Cartridges

Most office supply chain stores take back the printer ink cartridges. Check with your local Office Depot, Staples, Office Max and local office supply stores. Some even offer rewards points towards next purchase for the returns.

Or try Product Company's with return programs, most are listed on the box.

Mattresses & Box springs

Always ask about a **Take Back/Removal Program** where you purchase your new mattress!!

A Bedder World Company picks up mattresses in some areas to recycle them, you can get pricing and schedule a pickup online at <https://www.abedderworld.com/ohio-locations/>

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Check with your local haulers or landfill. Because mattresses and box springs cannot be compacted and little weight in comparison to the airspace they take up landfills may charge to accept them or not take them at all.

Check with the Thermostat Manufacturer to see if they will take them back for disposal.

Mobile Homes

A demolished **manufactured** or mobile home could be C&DD if it was an anchored structure. Also, if the mobile home is listed on the real property tax list in accordance with **ORC Section 4503.061**, then it is a structure and, when demolished, is C&DD. PAINT

Household paints are no longer considered hazardous waste (unless dated before 1990). Most paints sold are latex or water-based paints. Check the label on your paint can to determine what kind of paint you have. Latex paint is 99% water and 1% rubber, and is safe to dispose of with your household trash when it is dried out.

Commercially available paint hardeners such as cat litter, sawdust, cement mix, or oil-dry may be added to left-over paint to solidify the unused product to the point it has no free liquid. Another option may be to spread out a large trash bag & place crumpled newspapers over top, drizzle paint over newspapers, continue with layers until can is empty. This allows for increase surface area and paint will dry, then wrap bag around newspapers with dried paint. The lid may also be left off in a well-ventilated space away from children and pets to speed up the drying process. Once dried completely it can be disposed of in your regular garbage.

Oil-based paint and the solvents used to remove this type of paint (i.e. mineral spirits, paint thinner, turpentine) are flammable and considered household hazardous waste (HHW). These and any paints made before 1990 should be stored and brought to our next Household Hazardous Waste Collection (labeled with lids on tight). Paints made before 1977 may contain lead and paints made before 1990 may contain mercury.

- **Number 6 type Foam** is now acceptable as a single stream for a special JB Green Team recycling program. Number 6 Foam usually includes egg cartons, food containers, cups, appliance and electronic packaging foams. Visit our recycling page for details

- **Other Styrofoam** such as peanuts, bubble wrap, pipe insulation, soft or squishy foam, craft foam, foam board insulation, glossy foam, etc. is not acceptable at JB Green Team. Dispose of these type in your regular garbage or contact local shipping, packaging & moving companies for donation options or visit www.earth911.com for mailing options.

Televisions

All newer flat screen TV's are recyclable and accepted at local Electronics Recycling businesses, see "Electronics" above for details. However the older box style CRT Televisions may not be, and are now considered hazardous waste in some states due to the toxins in the glass.

As always we recommend to our residents to ALWAYS ask about a take-back program for your older tube (CRT) TV when purchasing a new one.
